Background

On June 23, 2016 a workshop on ERA and Innovation Union: Performance-based research funding – towards more effective national research and innovation systems in the Danube region will be organized in Chisinau (Republic of Moldova) in the frame of the Danube-INCO.NET project. Invited participants are policy-makers, programme owners, research administrators and managers (i.e. public authorities, agencies, higher education institutions performing R&I, academies, research institutes) who are:

- involved in the design or negotiation of reforms of the national, regional or institutional systems, including possible legislative reforms, both regarding the assessment and improvement of R&I performance, and the design of procedures for allocating R&I funding, such as calls for proposals and international peer-review procedures;
- responsible for implementing such systems or reforms;
- involved in developing or managing the statistical systems on R&I and linking them to the EU R&I monitoring system;
- subject to the assessments of R&I performance or funding procedures at the institutional or project level.

The *specific objectives* of the workshop consist in:

- analysing the state of progress in both EU countries and in non-EU countries regarding the level of competition in research and innovation funding and usage of performance indicators as criteria for R&D funding;
- discussing key issues in the Danube countries in this regard from the national perspectives, focusing on the non-EU Danube region countries;
- transferring good practices from Danube countries with well-functioning R&I systems to those with identified deficiencies in this regard;
- identifying concrete measures to be recommended to policy-makers and funding agencies in the countries with ongoing reformation processes of R&I systems for enhancing progress towards catching-up to international excellence standards.
